The commission commented to Mr. Moore and Mr. Hamilton that the commission is being left out of many important discussions and meetings about projects that concern the Harbor. Some of those projects are:

1. The sidewalk in front of the parking spaces next to the water which is in terrible shape.
2. The proposed tearing up of the 2 year old cobblestone walkway from the parking lot to the large gazebo and replacing it with hot top which the commission knew nothing about.
3. The gas/diesel fuel tanks. This project is now into its third year and once again it appears that after being told the money is there it is not. The current gas tank and pump are living on borrowed time.

The commission also said that they have a priority list for capital improvements but it is not being followed by the powers that be.

Councilor Hamilton suggested a work shop for all parties involved with the Harbor so everyone gets on the same page. The commission eagerly accepted the idea.


## **NEW BUSINESS**
