OLD BUSINESS

Fuel tank project. Things are moving along. Andrew McCullough is expected to have the final plan done by the end of December. It may need a special council meeting for a vote to get it going. The commission and city manager both agree to get it done ASAP and not worry if it is in the middle of the boating season.

NEW BUSINESS

Members were given copies of the Harbor Ordinances for review. We need to get this done in the next couple of months. Email back and forth our recommendations. Use GPS coordinates wherever we can instead of old name references of landmarks that might not exist any longer.

There has been some interest from fisherman to winter over their boats in the Harbor. It was agreed that \$2000 for a season from 11/1-5/1 would be appropriate.


We will be having a meeting in January where normally do not to discuss the budget and the ordinances.

- The Harbor closed on October 15th.
- Fuel sales total for this season is 8622.1 gallons. Last year's fuel sales was 6485.4 gallons. That's an increase of 2136.7 gallons this season.
- The ice eaters are installed and waiting for water temperatures to fall below freezing before I turn them on.

- We have pulled the launch ramp floats.
- All the boats are gone, thanks in part to the report in the Bangor Daily News about our ice eaters. I have been approached by two fisherman asking about spots for their boats for next season that might be available.
