CITY MANAGER REPORT

The city has received a \$50,000 grant to go towards the newest landscape design for the harbor. The project has an \$80,000 total price. The remainder can be paid with TIF funds.

OLD BUSINESS

The final design for the fuel tanks has been submitted by Andrew McCollough. The design will be submitted to the DOT as soon as possible by the city. The commission agreed that fuel must be available June 29 through July 8 for the busy July 4th week. The commission all agreed on no construction limitation time periods. This should insure more bidders and reasonable bids. Steve Henry and Mark Remick will be part of the working group with the City Manager and council members as far as the project is concerned.

HARBOR MASTER REPORT

We have had a couple of inquiries for in the water boat storage this year. Adam is going to put a boat in one of the slips with an ice eater going to see how the boat fares.


NEW BUSINESS
